

THE STRUCTURE OF THE A.P.G.

Reflecting the beliefs of Aboriginal people throughout our country, the A.P.G. is governed by a body of Elders. They are entirely autonomous, acting as they should as the respected and prestigious heads of our government. As the Elders establish themselves, they will lead the way by negotiating with the leaders of other countries, develop policies and give public speeches. The Elders will control entry to their membership, as is entirely appropriate.

Beneath them comes the Executive Council, made up of -

The Executive Council positions can be filled by popular elections or by co-opting appropriate people.

So why should they be banished to compete with younger Aborigines who have not yet achieved the status deserving of our elders?
